4. First Aid Procedures

Description of first aid measures

General information: Immediately remove any clothing soiled by the product. Symptoms of poisoning may even occur after several hours; therefore medical observation for at least 48 hours after the accident. Take affected persons out into the fresh air.

After inhalation: Supply fresh air; consult a doctor in case of complaints. Provide oxygen treatment if affected person has difficulty breathing. In case of irregular breathing or respiratory arrest provide artificial respiration.

After skin contact: Brush off loose particles from skin. Immediately remove any clothing soiled by the product. Immediately wash with water and soap and rinse thoroughly. If skin irritation continues, consult a doctor

After eye contact: Protect unharmed eye. Remove contact lenses if worn. Rinse opened eye for several minutes under running water. Then consult a doctor.

After swallowing: Rinse out mouth and then drink plenty of water. Do not induce vomiting; immediately call for medical help.
